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East Gippsland Map

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The East Gippsland region covers 2.2 million ha of land, and 60,000 km of waterways in eastern Victoria. This is about 10% of Victoria. The region is entirely south of the Great Dividing Range and includes the catchments of streams from the Mitchell River eastwards.

The region spans the Mitchell, Tambo and Nicholson River basins which drain into the Gippsland Lakes. The Snowy and Far East Gippsland River basins drain to the coast via estuaries.

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The West Gippsland region extends from west of Warragul to the Gippsland Lakes, and from the Great Dividing Range to Wilson's Promontory and Bass Strait. The area covers 17,685 km² with a population of around 169,000 people.

The region contains three major basins. The Latrobe and the Thomson basins drain the Great Dividing Range and the northern slopes of the Strzelecki Ranges into the Gippsland Lakes, and the South Gippsland basin drains the southern slopes of the Strzelecki Ranges to the coast between San Remo and Loch Sport.
